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Hi!

We have been using OpenVZ for a few months and are really satisfied with this project. Thanks a lot.

Neithertheless, we have a problem with one out of three virtual server. On this one, the quota system fails. The only difference with the two others is the filesystem size that exceed, in this case, 40 gygabites.

It is possible to activate the quota system with a quite small filesystem and then to progressively increase its size (with rsync for example). But, if we try to directly start (or restart) a server on such a big filesystem, it fails with the error :
vzquota : (error) Quota on syscall for 123: Device or resource busy

Is there a size limit for the filesystem of an OpenVZ virtual server, with quota enabled?
