Yes, that would be true. But the kinds of groupings that we're talking about are supersets of namespaces, not semantically equivalent to them. To use Eric's "shoe" analogy from earlier, it's like insisting that we use the term "sneaker" to refer to all footwear, including ski boots and birkenstocks ...
