Also, check that:

1. you have conntrack firewall disabled on the host or add:
options ip_conntrack ip_conntrack_enable_ve0=1
to your /etc/modprobe.conf
2. you have disabled SELinux in /etc/selinux/config:
SELINUX=disabled

> Of course you can, just download a RPM kernel image and the ovz tools
> or compile a vanilla kernel with patches on the system and replace the
> existing kernel. There is no need to have physical access to the host,
> a remote shell connection is all you need. But be careful with the a
> vanilla kernel configuration, wrong settings may result in system hang
> while booting the new ovz enabled kernel.
