> I'd guess we would need to:

> 1. Beg Stephen :)
> 2. Work with the lkml community to decide which patches are
> sufficiently agreed-upon at least in principle to go into
> linux-next. I really think Eric's netns/sysfs patchset
> belongs there. I'd also like to see the freezer container
> patchset.
> 3. Pick someone to be maintain that tree. Ideally someone
> whom everyone here can agree upon.

I think Andrew said he intends to get most of -mm into linux-next as soon in the next release cycle. So this may not be a long term problem.

The classic challenge is that we really need most of the patches to go through other maintainers because they are not for subsystems we maintain. So I am fairly certain things like our network namespace work will show up in linux-next because they show up in net-next-2.6.
