/vz/template/cache/CentOS-5.4-i386-ISPCconfig2.tar.gz"

This appears to be an incorrect command (at least on my system).

This is because (a) 'f' option should be followed by a file name, i.e. "tar ...f file.tar.gz". In your case you specify to pack the file /vz/template/cache/CentOS-5.4-i386-ISPCconfig2.tar.gz into a tarball named (literally) "--numeric-owner". So no, you have not recreated your tarball using the correct options, instead you are just using the old one.  
(b) You forgot the dot (.) at the end.

The correct command would be something like

```
tar -pczf /vz/template/cache/CentOS-5.4-i386-ISPCconfig2.tar.gz --numeric-owner .
```

So, please

- (1) use the correct tar command and options
- (2) remove the old tarball before creating a new one
- (3) check the resulting tarball's date/time.

Also you can check if the uids/gids inside the tarball are correct. For that, find out the uid/gid of mysql inside the CT:

```
ls -ln /var/run/mysqld  
grep mysql /etc/passwd  
grep mysql /etc/group
```

Then, check the resulting tarball:

```
tar tzvf file.tar.gz var/run/mysqld
```

You should see uid/gid as numbers (not names) and they should be the same as the ones you saw the step before (in ls -ln and grep output).

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
