I'm running into a problem discussed here:

On boot of VE with a NFS share the script `/etc/network/if-up.d/mountnfs` freezes apparently because it tries to connect using the `venet0` device which has the ip `127.0.0.1` and obviously cannot connect to the NFS share. What it should do is bring up `venet0:0` and connect through that.

How can I change the order in which interfaces are brought up? `/etc/network/interfaces` says that you shouldn't edit the file
