> In a simple bash script named "test.sh", I used to call another shell

> script "part1.sh" keeping the same Env variables like this:

>

> \$head -n 1 test.sh

> . ./part1.sh

>

> Now, I would like to do the same with vzctl runscript:

>

> \$head -n 1 test.sh

> vzctl runscript 1110 part1.sh

```
echo '#!/bin/bash' > tmp.sh
```

```
env | awk -F= '{print $1 "=" $2}' >> tmp.sh
```

```
cat part1.sh >> tmp.sh
```

```
vzctl runscript 1110 tmp.sh
```

```
rm tmp.sh
```

Escaping quotes in environmental variables or using mktemp is left as an exercise to the reader.
