It should be 2.6.32 and the HN should probably be RHEL6 (or its derivative like SL6/CentOS6). If it's debian -- the user should install RHEL6's kernel (there was a discussion in the neighbor thread about debian and proxmox kernel [1]) because debian's kernel don't have vswap support (that's AFAIR).

Personally, I don't get that thing: using debian as HN. OpenVZ ships their kernel for RHEL and tests them on RHEL, all the features goes there first before debian guys will incorporate them into their kernel. So, maybe it's a good idea to use RHEL as your HN just to minimize your work, wouldn't you think so? And if you hate RHEL so much -- hey, it's just the HN, you can do a bazillions of debian CTs there.

So, I would never recommend debian as a HN.
