The problem is, vzctl is feeling smart enough bypass init and try to use upstart directly. Unfortunately, upstart is not installed part of the upgrade process.

To fix the problem, you have to install upstart in a non-running container:

```
cd /var/lib/vz/root/XXX  
chroot .  
yum install upstart  
exit  
vzctl start XXX
```

be very careful to select the correct architecture (x86 or amd64)
