> 2. Since vzctl version 3.0.25, released in December 2010, reboot is

> implemented via

> - vzeventd is running, and check its log (it writes to /var/log/vzctl.log

> with vzeventd prefix)

>

>

> 3. If needed, you can run vzeventd in foreground with more verbose logging.

> See vzeventd(8) for more details.

This daemon was not running, so it works perfectly now!
