it is our fail,
factory repository should be disabled in stable branch.

We're going to release updated version soon,
right now please disable factory repo manually.

To confirm, /etc/yum.repos.d has (among others):

- factory.repo
- openvz.repo
- vzlinux.repo

We are to disable everything in factory.repo as well as any entry with factory in the name (like virtuoazzolinux-factory) found in vzlinux.repo -- does that sound accurate?

Since we never got a response from Virtuozzo devs (despite the factory repo being enabled being their screw-up) here's what fixes it:

```
yum-config-manager --disable factory
yum-config-manager --disable virtuoazzolinux-openvz-factory
yum-config-manager --disable virtuoazzolinux-factory
```

```
yum distribution-synchronization
```

Then reboot the node to ensure it boots into the new (security patched) kernel. The yum distribution-synchronization command will both install the newest kernel release and ensure all packages are no longer from factory.
