I would say that it's also broken for non-openvz hosts - I've previously run several separate copies of apache and ssh (each with their own init scripts) on a Debian host before, and restarting one hasn't killed the others...

Open bugs against Redhat/CentOS? I'd guess this problem will continue with LXC in the future too...

The solution is simply to run as little as possible on the host, and to fix the scripts for the stuff you need to run. Painful, but unavoidable. Maybe if you submit a patch to rhel, it could maybe make it into a release in a couple of years ;)
