This is known problem. Unfortunately you should not use vzpkgcache on 64 bit systems, but use precreated templates.

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AFAIK by hand, i.e. by installing RPM packages in non-root directory (e.g. /tmp/future_64bit_template) and then compressing this directory in .tar.gz archive. Probably some small modifications are done inside future template in order it to work completely as expected.
