- 5 - Import the new RPM-GPG key  
rpm --import http://mirror.centos.org/centos/RPM-GPG-KEY-CentOS-5
- 5 - Exit from VPS
- 6 - Change vps config file  
OSTEMPLATE="centos-4-i386-minimal"  
to  
OSTEMPLATE="centos-5-i386-minimal"
- 7 - Upgrade the remaining packages without issues  
vzyum VEID upgrade
- 8 - Delete .rpmsave and backup files from VE
- 9 - Create the template
