It is very easy. Let <veid> is upgraded VE, which you want use as a template.

- 1) clean network setting and other VE-specific information
- 2) stop VE
- 3) tar.gz VEs private area and place the archive in /vz/templates/cache/
- 4) now you can create VEs based on your template.
