I got the kernel installed: 2.6.16-027test011-0.12-ovz

vzquota-3.0.11-1

vzrpm44-python-4.4.1-22.5

kernel-ovz-2.6.16.46_027test011-0.12

vzctl-lib-3.0.18-1

vzrpm44-4.4.1-22.5

vzrpm43-4.3.3-7_nonptl.6

vzctl-3.0.18-1

vzpkg-2.7.0-18

well, I need the vzyum rpm too.
