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the problem is not in kernel and rpms, the problem is (apparently) in the bootloader.

Can you try reinstall grub bootloader code, something like
grub-install /dev/sda

SUBSTITUTE /dev/sda with whatever your boot drive is.

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Again. This is NOT a problem with that particular kernel, this is a problem with a bootloader caused by the fact your filesystem has errors. Just run fsck.

Quote:should i still run it?

You said you run it fine on other boxes. Thousands people run it. But I'm definitely not forcing you to run it (or any other thing), just trying to help you with your problem.

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No, "clean" just means that fsck thinks there's no need to check the FS. So you run fsck with -f flag (don't forget to unmount it first).
