I'm not specialist in Debian but I try to answer your questions:

1.Quote:Should I install linux-image-2.6.18-openvz-12-1etch1-686
instead of vmlinuz-2.6.18-openvz-13-1etch4-686 to have a possibility to update by apt-get?

Why do you think that vmlinuz version depends on possibility to update by apt-get? I suppose that you can use apt-get update with both versions of vmlinuz.

Quote:Debian kernel config + OpenVZ support = forzza kernel (fza)

So in my opinion these kernels differs in configs. You can download suitable .deb package and investigate it config.

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Hello Tirukill,

here's what you have to do to correctly install openvz on Debian:

1 - add this line to /etc/apt/source.list:

```
deb http://download.openvz.org/debian-systs etch openvz
```

2 - get the repository's key:

```
wget http://debian.systs.org/dso_archiv_signing_key.asc
```

3 - add it to apt :

```
apt-key add dso_archiv_signing_key.asc
```

4 - Update apt's cache :

```
apt-get update
```

5 - Now it's time to install the kernel (choose fza, I use openvz at work and it is the best):

```
apt-get install fzakernel-2.6.18-686
```

6 - Now boot on your new kernel

7 - When you rebooted you can install the rest :

```
apt-get install vzctl vzfzdump vzprocps vzctl-tmpl-debian
```

8 - You're all set!

PS : wiki.openvz.org has all the documentation one need to do anything with openvz, be sure to check it!

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Hi,

Vasily wrote me per pm:

Debian support for OpenVZ is complex. To start with, we have three repositories:

- * (1) official Debian repository (we only have user level tools and kernel-patch-openssl there) -- our packages are maintained by Ola Lundqvist.
- * (2) official OpenVZ repository (<http://download.openvz.org/debian/>) -- maintained by Ola Lundqvist as well.
- * (3) unofficial OpenVZ repository, maintained by Thorsten

Repo 1 is actually three repos -- for Debian Stable, Testing, and Unstable. In Stable we have some ancient kernel version, as policy disallows to do anything that bug fixes in it, and our newer kernels sometimes include newer features. In Unstable, we have 028stab051 now, before it was 039 -- we update only from time to time, not with each kernel release. In Testing we usually have what we had in Unstable about a month ago or so.

Repo 2 is updated at about the same rate as Debian Unstable.

Repo 3 is updated very often, always carry the latest kernels.

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Repository 3, maintained by Thorsten Schifferdecker (me) is an actually repository for Debian Stable aka etch, follow the updates like openvz.org, so the repo is updated more often than repo at debian.org

The repository at <http://debian.systs.org> (dso) and mirror at <http://download.openvz.org/debian-systs>, aimed to get actually OpenVZ packages, like OpenVZ linux kernels, OpenVZ tools, Debian VE OS Template and linux-patch-openssl installing OpenVZ in easy debianized way.

So Ola gets the new 028stab051 kernel patch taken from my linux-kernel-patch at <http://debian.systs.org> for the new Debian kernel-patch-openssl, stays at know the unstable (sid) repository at debian.org.
