However, for some reason inside my vz I can't do an Is or a tar on the directory without getting an error. I have shutdown apache and mysql and still get the error.

tar complains about the bad descriptor and corruption.

The gallery works fine and are no problems. I think this maybe a vz problem.

I want to upgrade the machine and move it over to another server but I can't finish rsyncing my vz because of this. Any help would be appreciated.

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Is there anything related in dmesg output?

I'm afraid this looks like a hardware (HDD) failure -- in this case in dmesg you will see errors like "unable to read sector" or smth.

I suggest you to copy as much data as possible from this HDD and replace it (or restore from last good backup to a new drive).
