seems that if I need to create VPS with distro other than Fedora or CentOS, I must build "OS template metadata"

Quote: Template metadata is a set of a few files containing the following information:

- * List of packages that form this template
- * Locations of package repositories
- * Scripts needed to be executed on various stages of template installation
- * Public GPG key(s) needed to check signatures of packages
- * Additional OpenVZ-specific packages

Can someone tell the best way to create a VPS for other Linux?
