since days I try to install the 50th ve, but it just stops with the following error message: failed to start with err=-11 / err=-12

by testing on the following hardware: Intel Core2Duo 6300 / 4 GB Ram / 250 GB HDD and Kernel 2.6.18-enterprise i was able to install the 50th ve.

I wanted to upgrade to that kernel on the quad core root, but I couldn't find it in apt-source

Did the support stop for that kernel? How can I get more than 49 ves to start on the FZA kernel?

I hope someone can help me and maybe still got the debian packets of the enterprise version anywhere.
