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OK, So I have been following this document
<http://www.trekitt.com/web-experiments/46-linux-virtualisati-on-with-openvz-on-centos.html> and I am able to run the vztmpl-centos-4.i386 template from the yum repositories. I want to use Centos 5 so I followed this,
You can also download some pre-created OS templates from OpenVZ.org
<http://openvz.org/download/template/cache/>
and dump the OSname.tar.gz straight into /vz/template/cache/ , but be advised you will have to create your own OS template metadata in order to update it, more discussed later in the article.

6. Using Pre-Created Templates

You can download some pre-created OS templates from OpenVZ.org
<http://openvz.org/download/template/cache/>
and dump the OSname.tar.gz straight into /vz/template/cache/

Here's an example:

```
$ cd /vz/template/cache  
$ wget http://download.openvz.org/template/precreated/contrib/centos-5-i386-minimal.tar.gz
```

These pre-created OS templates can be used immediately by using --ostemplate parameter to use it.
