What does it mean "nothing"? Did command return with success or with error message or

anything?

I deleted any references to the init scripts containing reference to vz with the hopes of recreating the init scripts by re-installing the RPM.

It's not clear if you change files from the particular package or from several ones.
In extreme case, you can remove vzctl package from your HN and then install it again.

Anyway, exact output messages would be very useful.

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I don't have any output as if I type service vz start nothing happens. I also manually deleted the init scripts and symlinks in /etc/rc.d/ with the hopes of getting the rpm to recreate them with the --force option. reinstalling the RPM does not create any startup scripts for vz to start in the /etc/rc.d/ directory's . I deleted all refernces to vz with the hopes of re-establishing the files again from the rpm.

So I will ask the question again;

How can get the symlinks and scripts recreated from the RPM?
