I admit I haven't been active there for a long time, since we have moved on to a in-house proprietary control panel, but from what I can gather from the forums and such, I haven't seen anyone even mention RHEL 6.

Moving to RHEL 6 would at least require rebuilding a lot of the underlying hypervm server packages, such as lxlighhttpd, lxphp, etc. and extensive testing, of course.

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
