I tarred up /vz/private/\$vpsid and /vz/conf/\$vpsid.conf. And copied them to another machine and installed them in teh proper directories, and did a vzctl start.

The vps did start, and i can even exec commands, but i can't enter into it, neither does sshd work, even though i can see that the ip addresses have been configured.

So the upshot is that: what i did is not the actual way to migrate. So the question is, how do i go ahead with a simple migrate. i had actually thought that simply copying private/vpsid and the conf file to another machine should do the trick. but i i think i am very wrong.
