Guys,

Running Debian and Fedora (cores 4 and 5) VEs on top of Debian Sarge.

If I do a find / -print on a Debian VE, it works fine with no error messages or warnings, but in Fedora, I get:

```
find: WARNING: Hard link count is wrong for /proc/1: this may be a bug in your filesystem driver.
Automatically turning on find's -noleaf option. Earlier results may have failed to include directories
that should have been searched.
```

The find still seems to work, but I'll have users asking about this and want to explain correctly (and also ensure it's not a bug I have to worry about).

Any ideas what's going on? This is with the precreated Fedora Core 4 and 5 minimal on OpenVZ stable (2.6..
