
Subject: Bug in vzcfgvalidate?

Guys,

I'm concerned there is a config in vzcfgvalidate in Stable. I'm running on Debian Sarge.

I noticed my VE was getting failures on OTHERSOCKBUF, so I decided to take a look.

First, I did:

```
/etc/vz# vzcfgvalidate conf/103.conf
```

```
Error: othersockbuf.lim-othersockbuf.bar should be > 512000 (currently, 204800)
```

However, looking in 103.conf, I see clearly that:

```
OTHERSOCKBUF="132096:336896"
```

So, just for kicks, I did:

```
vzctl set 103 --othersockbuf 512000 --save
```

I checked in 103.conf to make sure it took. It did.

```
OTHERSOCKBUF="512000:512000"
```

However, now, running vzcfgvalidate, I see:

```
/etc/vz# vzcfgvalidate conf/103.conf
```

```
Error: othersockbuf.lim-othersockbuf.bar should be > 512000 (currently, 0)
```

Something is obviously buggy here.

A strace shows this:

```

```

```
write(2, "\n", 1
)          = 1
exit_group(1)          = ?
```

I'm going to submit a bug report, but if I'm overlooking something obvious, please let me know.
