That entry in the man page is pretty cryptic tho; what exactly does "Disable VE start" actually MEAN / entail?

--Also from the man page, it looks like checkpoint/restore is available, so suspend/resume looks doable:

Checkpointing and restore  
Checkpointing is a feature of OpenVZ kernel which allows to save a complete state of a running VE, and to restore it later.

chkpnt veid [--dumpfile name]

This command saves a complete state of a running VE to a dump file, and stops the VE. If an option --dumpfile is not set, default dump file name /vz/dump/Dump.veid is used.

restore veid [--dumpfile name]

This command restores a VE from dump file created by the chkpnt command.
