As far as I could see, Pavel's problem wasn't actually an Oops, it was a WARN\_ON() when allocating a zero length chunk of memory. There's ongoing discussion as to whether this counts as a problem with the allocators or the kmallocc() code, since it used to be OK to allocate a zero-length chunk.
