> If streaming applications would otherwise litter the pagecache with

> unwanted data, then limiting their total memory footprint (with a

> single limit) and forcing them to drop old data sooner sounds like a

> great idea.

Actually, reading what you wrote more carefully, that's sort of what you were already saying. But it's not clear why you wouldn't also want to limit the anon pages for a job, if you're already concerned that it's not playing nicely with the rest of the system.
