> during rtnl_unlock now. There is no rtnl_trylock in the rtnetlink_rcv
> anymore.

> Normal code path is the following:
> netlink_sendmsg
> netlink_unicast
> netlink_sendskb
> skb_queue_tail
> netlink_data_ready
> rtnetlink_rcv
> mutex_lock(&rtnl_mutex);
> netlink_run_queue(sk, qlen, &rtnetlink_rcv_msg);
> mutex_unlock(&rtnl_mutex);

> So, it is possible, that packets can be present in the rtnl->sk_receive_queue
> during rtnl_unlock, but there is no need to process them at that moment as
> rtnetlink_rcv for that packet is pending.
