net.ipv4.conf.venet0.proxy_arp = 0
net.ipv4.conf.eth2.proxy_arp = 1
net.ipv4.conf.eth1.proxy_arp = 1
net.ipv4.conf.eth0.proxy_arp = 0
net.ipv4.conf.lo.proxy_arp = 0
net.ipv4.conf.default.proxy_arp = 0
net.ipv4.conf.all.proxy_arp = 0
```

You should have proxy\_arp turned on at your gateway interface.
